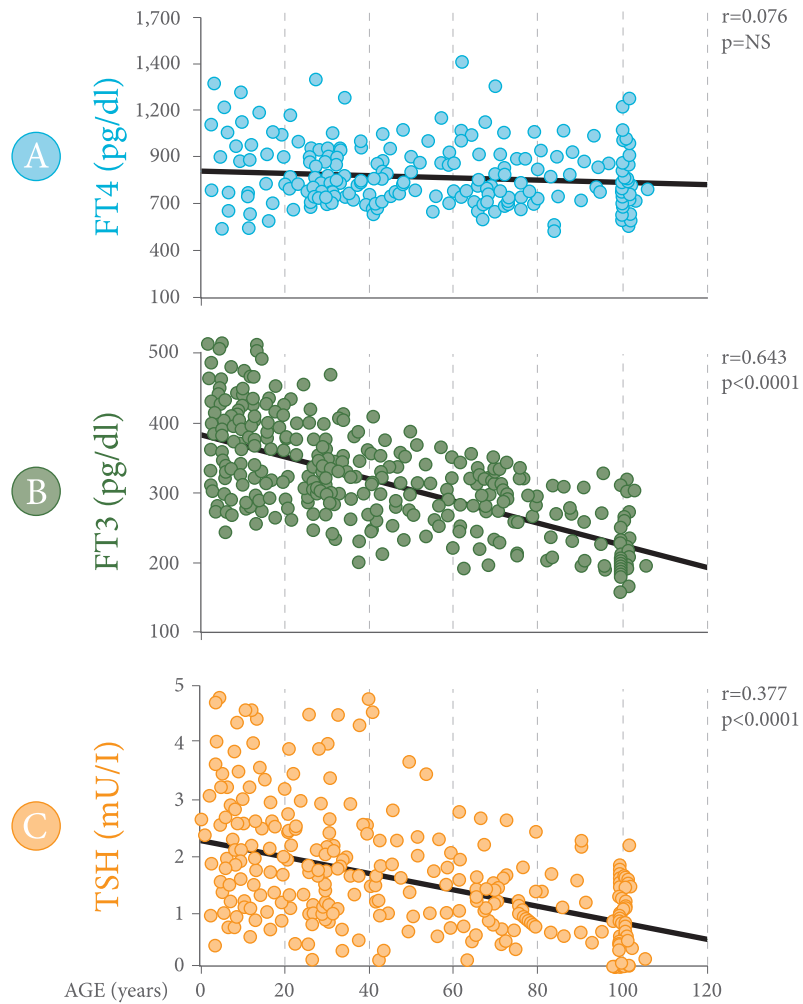

Demonstrates that TSH is not a reliable marker of active thyroid (T3) levels (low T3 levels are associated with decreased, not increased, TSH levels).
